Mark your calendar. The 11th Annual Jazz Walk is scheduled for September 6th, 7th, and 8th. CASC will host two bands on Saturday, September 7th, 5 pm – 9 pm. The Comfort Food Band featuring World Fusion music with Jazz undertones is on at 5 pm followed by the Elnah Jordan Experience of Blues and Jazz starting at 7 pm. A suggested donation of \$10 is requested at the door. A no-host bar and food are available for a nominal fee. Music continues throughout the month with Blues Man CT Thompson featured at the September 20th Green Dolphin Lounge, 6 pm – 9 pm. Cost: \$25 (Lifetime), \$30 (Annual) and \$35 Non-Members and at the door.

doors are first. We have ordered all new doors in the dining room facing the water. This comes at a cost of \$20K each and/or \$40K together. The old doors are no longer available. Fixing them would have been \$20K each with no warranty so the board opted for the new doors.

Sharper By the Mile! CASC's SHARP Kicks Off Third Year

CASC's social worker, Anthony Cryer, is excited by the team turnout for SHARP's (Sharing History through Active Reminiscence and Photo-Imagery) August session. "This is our strongest kickoff yet," said Cryer. "We have 6 teams walking and a waiting list." In its third consecutive year, SHARP is a culturally engaging walking and brain health program that began with improving cognitive health among older African Americans with ties to Seattle's Central District. Each walking route is bolstered by conversation prompts to record history as told by us. "SHARP is an opportunity to share our stories and reflect on those I remember when



moments," said Cryer. "Over the years, we have had lots of positive feedback. Consistently, walkers have enjoyed the routes so much, they have requested more routes," Cryer

added. "We are putting together new routes and being intentional about the growth of this program."

If you are at least 55, in good general health, and can walk one mile, you can benefit from joining SHARP! Whether or not you are experiencing mild memory loss, participating in SHARP offers tremendous benefits including cognitive and physical exercise, connection to friends and community, small group discussions, and looking back on memories of living and working in the Central District.
